Successfully completed courses can be applied toward the Paralegal Associate of Applied Science degree providing a time advantage for completion.

The Immigration Law Occupational Skills Award (OSA) is designed to provide students with specialized knowledge and practical skills to support attorneys handling immigration cases. The award is ideal for individuals seeking to learn more about the legal support required in law firms, government agencies, nonprofit organizations, and corporate legal departments that deal with immigration matters such as visas, asylum, and naturalization. The core courses provide an overview of the legal system, coverage of key immigration policies, visa categories, asylum and refugee law, and naturalization procedures, the exploration of the federal litigation process, and other legal documentation such as petitions, affidavits, case filing, and immigration related documents presented in case files. Successfully completed courses can be applied toward the Paralegal Associate of Applied Science degree providing a time advantage for completion.

The Paralegal Associate of Applied Science (AAS) is a comprehensive degree plan designed to provide students with the knowledge and practical skills necessary to work as paralegals in law firms, government agencies, nonprofit organizations, and corporate legal departments for a variety of industries. This degree plan combines theoretical legal knowledge and applied practical skills to prepare graduates for a variety of roles within the legal profession. The specializations of family law and immigration are embedded into the plan, however, students also develop skills for legal writing and research, contracts, business organizations, business professional communication, and other common specializations of law. After graduation, a select number of successfully completed courses can be applied toward the Bachelor of Applied Science degree in Organizational Leadership providing a time advantage for completion.
